

## Introduction

In the academic year 2022-23 we received **£16,760**. The money has been spent to fulfil the following grant conditions; additional money was invested by school to supplement our sports premium.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of P.E. and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching P.E. and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

<b>Show racism the red card</b>	Children in year 3, 4 and 5 have had access to Show Racism the Red Card workshops. This has had a clear link to our equality and diversity mission which we have been promoting all year. As the school has a low BAME population this education is essential and equips the children with their transition to secondary school. <b>P.E. For Small Schools CPD</b>	Teachers to be supported in new 'P.E. This cost will also include any cover/supply costs we incur during the year.
